How to Calculate the Freezing and Boiling Point | Sciencing

The boiling point of a substance is the temperature at which the vapor pressure of the liquid equals the pressure surrounding the liquid, and the liquid changes into a vapor. The boiling point of a liquid varies depending upon the surrounding pressure.

The boiling point is the temperature at which the gas from the liquid is pushing the air with the same force the air is pushing back.

The boiling point (BP) and melting point (MP) of an organic molecule is related to: 1) the molecular weight of the molecule and 2) the "stickiness" of individual molecules for their neighbors. For example, molecules in a liquid are held together by attractive interactions be-

tween molecules.

Procedure (A) To determine the boiling point of water. Take 25-30 ml of water in a boiling tube and add few pumice stones to it. Clamp the boiling tube on iron stand with two holed cork, in one hole fix the thermometer and in the other one fix the delivery tube.

Boiling points of water at absolute pressures ranging from 1 to 70 bara or 14.7 to 1000 psia are indicated in the figures and tables below: See Water and Heavy Water for thermodynamic properties at standard conditions.

Intermolecular forces (IMFs) can be used to predict relative boiling points. The stronger the IMFs, the lower the vapor pressure of the substance and the higher the boiling point. Therefore, we can compare the relative strengths of the IMFs of the compounds to predict their relative boiling points.

Water has a boiling point elevation constant of 0.512. Plug your values into the following equation to calculate the new boiling point of your solution: Boiling point = old boiling point + K x molality. Our water example would look like this:

Boiling point = $100 + 0.512 \times 0.5 = 100.256$ degrees Celsius.

This calc can be extremely useful in designing experimental processes or making safety assessments. Enter the known boiling point at a known pressure (which will often be 1 atm). Then enter the temperature or pressure you are interested in and the calc will give the estimated pressure or temperature that boiling will take place.

Determine the boiling point of: Ethyl Acetate (Literature Boiling Point: 77 o C) 1. Securely attach the water tubing to the condenser - water in at the bottom and out at the top. It is easier to wet the ends of the rubber tubing before sliding them onto the glassware. 2. Measure approximately 1ml of ethyl acetate into a 3ml conical vial. 3.

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To determine the boiling point of water- Lab Work

The boiling point of water is the temperature at which the liquid water vapor pressure is equal to the pressure surrounding the body, and the body transforms into a vapour. The boiling point is the temperature for a particular liquid to boil at. For example, the boiling point for water, at a pressure of 1 atm, is 100 degrees Celsius.
