One of the earliest traceable societies that influenced our modern world is the Proto-Indo-European society, consisting of a people ancestral to most of Europe, the near East and Southern Asia.

pean language that descended from the Proto-Indo-European language. It is related to all other Indo-European languages through this parent language. Q: How accurate is Proto-Indo-European? Through the process of comparative reconstruction, linguists have reconstructed Proto-Indo-European.

The Proto-Indo-Europeans were a hypothetical prehistoric ethnolinguistic group of Eurasia who spoke Proto-Indo-European, the ancestor of the Indo-European languages according to linguistic reconstruction. Knowledge of them comes chiefly from that linguistic reconstruction, along with material evidence from archaeology and archaeogenetics. The Proto-Indo-Europeans likely lived during the late Ne-

olithic, or roughly the 4th millennium BC. Mainstream scholarship places them in the Pontic ...

Just as languages such as Spanish, French, Portuguese and Italian are all descended from Latin, Indo-European languages are believed to derive from a hypothetical language known as Proto-Indo-European, which is no longer spoken.

The different branches of Indo-European religion – Germanic, Celtic, Hindu, etc. – all had some common core features due to their inheritance from the Proto-Indo-Europeans. Knowing what those core features were enables one to understand, in light of those models, some elements of Germanic religion that wouldn't otherwise make sense.

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The separation of the proto-Indo-European (PIE) language from its parent Nostratic tongue took place approximately at the 6000 BC mark (see the first map, above).
